Notice to Mariners

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN MARINE ACT 1982

CLOSURE OF WATERS TO ANCHORING Vicinity of Ship Loading Mooring Port of Wyndham

Mariners are advised that a black mooring buoy, approx 1.2m in diameter, has been installed at the following location by the Port of Wyndham:

As plotted on Chart AUS 32, Datum WGS84, and printed 03/09/2007:

Lat: 15°26.277S' Long: 128°5.933' E

This Mooring has been installed for bulk carrier ships loading iron ore from barges. The mooring buoy is equipped with a yellow light system FI (Q) Y 2M and has two (2) anchors deployed approximately 150 metres north and south.

Acting pursuant to Section 66 of the Western Australian Marine Act 1982, I hereby close all waters within a 500 metre radius of the above mooring buoy to all anchoring. Vessels may still navigate through this anchoring closure.

Mariners are advised to navigate with caution when transiting through this area and keep well clear of ship loading operations at all times.
