An additional shark monitoring buoy will be deployed at the following location in Warnbro Sound.

U. Lat 32° 20.973 'S Long 115° 44.000 'E

The buoys are approximately 2 metres in height, yellow in colour and fitted with a yellow flashing light FI Y 5s 2M. No vessel is to be moored to these buoys at any time.

Mariners are advised to use caution when transiting the area and to keep well clear of the shark monitoring buoys at all times.
