NAVIGATION HAZARD Deployment of Monitoring Stations Coastal & Inland Waters Shire of Ashburton, Pilbara

Mariners are advised that a network of acoustic receivers has been deployed at the following locations as part of the Murdoch University Pilbara Sawfish Program:

The receivers are attached to unlit yellow buoys, approx 25cm in diameter and will be deployed until around 31 May 2012. No vessel is to interfere with these stations at any time.
