Commercial Vessels (Other than Fishing Vessels)		
Payable on the day of first entry of any vessel (other than a fishing vessel or a vessel referred to in Regulation 18(a) to (i):		
1. Where the length of the vessel is 70 metres or more		
- per ton of gross registered tonnage of the vessel	0.00	0.00
2. Where the length of the vessel:		
- does not exceed 6 metres	108	111.20
- exceeds 6 metres but does not exceed 10 metres	141.4	145.60
- exceeds 10 metres but does not exceed 20 metres	206.9	213.10

Bunker Rate		
Instead of the rates given in items 1 and 2, any vessel entering any port for coal, fuel oil, supplies or order, and not loading or unloading cargo or taking on more than ten passengers, may pay per entry:	96.3	99.10
Subject to Regulation 18(3), no conservancy dues are payable:		
- under item 1 above if the vessel has paid conservancy dues under that item on entering any port of the State within the immediately preceding 2 months; or	0	0.00
- under item 2 above if the vessel has paid conservancy dues under that item on entering any port of the State within the immediately preceding 12 months.		

Note: As of 30 September 1999 conservancy dues for Commercial Vessels over 70 metres were set at zero.

Marine Navigational Aids Regulations 1985

Fees payable in Respect of Fishing Vessels

(Regulation 3)

The Master and the owner of a fishing vessel other than a fishing vessel:

- which does not exceed 6 metres in length;
- which is engaged solely in fishing in estuaries or inland waters; or
- for which conservancy fees are prescribed as payable under the Shipping and Pilotage (Ports & Harbours) Regulations made under the Shipping & Pilotage Act 1967 are jointly and severally liable to pay to the Department the fee that is appropriate to that fishing vessel.

The following fees are payable in respect of the provision of marine navigational aids outside any port under the control of a port authority and the approaches to that port:
