

		This is important in an emergency as it can be used to request help. It is also useful to log on with a volunteer sea search and rescue group before you go boating.
		This should be carried on board all boats in case someone injures themselves. The contents include bandages, seasickness tablets, antiseptic cream and sunscreen.
		Children should wear these at all times when going out on a boat. Make sure that it fits snugly.
		All boats, especially small ones, should carry one of these if they go out at night time.
		These can be used to signal to others that you are in trouble and require assistance. They are dangerous to operate and should only be handled by an adult or the skipper.
		This can also be used to let rescue authorities know that you are in trouble and require assistance. It can be used anywhere and rescuers will know exactly where you are.

- Plasticine can be used to hold the sail and mast onto the boat and for making passengers.
- You may also need glue, tape and scissors.

It is compulsory to carry life jackets for everybody on board, a signaling device, (flares or an EVDS) and a distress beacon (EPIRB or PLB) when going more than 400m into the ocean.

When you are loading your boat you should fit as much gear in the boat as possible.
