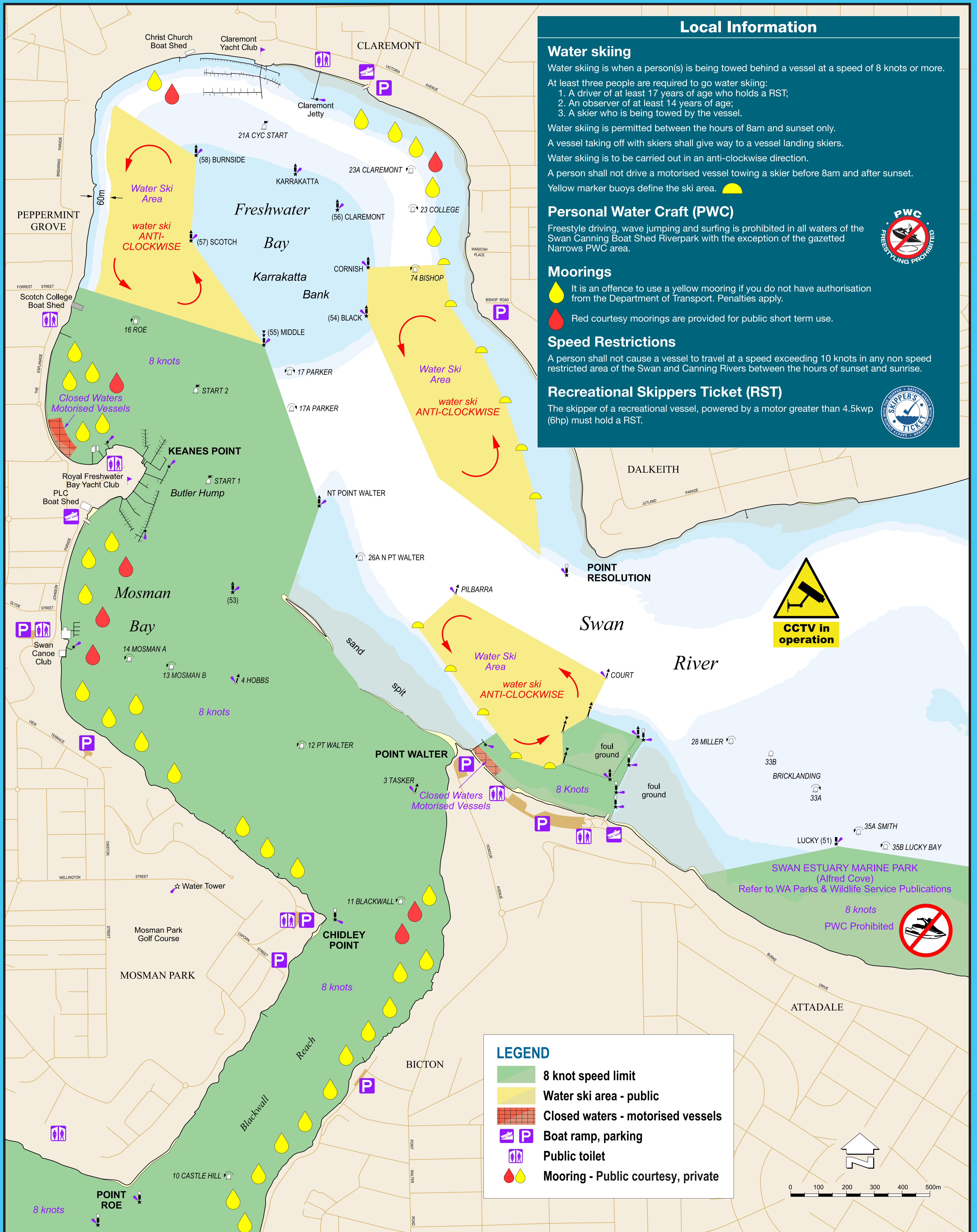




# Lower Swan Water Ski Areas

## Marine Safety Information



### Local Information

#### Water skiing

Water skiing is when a person(s) is being towed behind a vessel at a speed of 8 knots or more.

At least three people are required to go water skiing:

1. A driver of at least 17 years of age who holds a RST;
2. An observer of at least 14 years of age;
3. A skier who is being towed by the vessel.

Water skiing is permitted between the hours of 8am and sunset only.

A vessel taking off with skiers shall give way to a vessel landing skiers.

Water skiing is to be carried out in an anti-clockwise direction.

A person shall not drive a motorised vessel towing a skier before 8am and after sunset.

Yellow marker buoys define the ski area.

#### Personal Water Craft (PWC)

Freestyle driving, wave jumping and surfing is prohibited in all waters of the Swan Canning Boat Shed Riverpark with the exception of the gazetted Narrows PWC area.



#### Moorings

It is an offence to use a yellow mooring if you do not have authorisation from the Department of Transport. Penalties apply.

Red courtesy moorings are provided for public short term use.

#### Speed Restrictions

A person shall not cause a vessel to travel at a speed exceeding 10 knots in any non speed restricted area of the Swan and Canning Rivers between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

#### Recreational Skippers Ticket (RST)

The skipper of a recreational vessel, powered by a motor greater than 4.5kw (6hp) must hold a RST.
