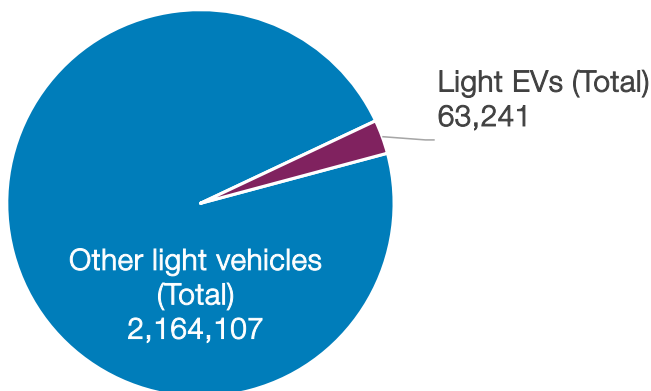

Quarterly EV growth continues at double-digit pace

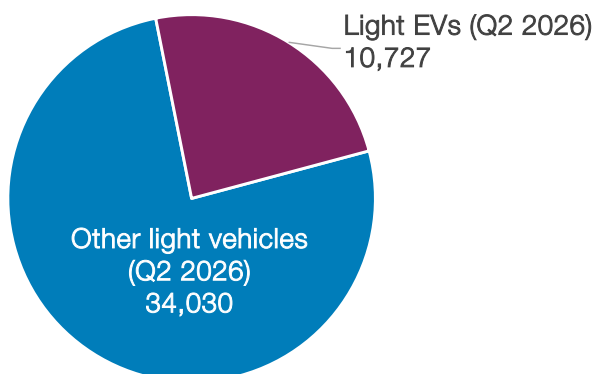
- **Total** light vehicle licences as of 30 June 2026 (Q2 2026):
 - All light vehicles (including EVs): 2,227,348
 - Light EVs only: 63,241 (2.8% of all light vehicle licences)



- **Total** light EV licences quarterly changes
 - 31 March (Q1 2026): 52,758 (+12.2%)
 - 30 June (Q2 2026): 63,241 (+19.9%)

EV growth increased by 19.9% during Q2 2026, compared with 12.2% in Q1 2026. This stronger result is consistent with Q1 expectations that uncertainty around fuel prices may encourage increased EV uptake.

- **New** light vehicle licences for Q2 2026:
 - All light vehicles (including EVs): 44,757
 - Light EVs only: 10,727 (24% of new light vehicle licences)



Key insights continued



Fuel price uncertainty likely supporting EV demand

- Overall EV licences continued to grow strongly in Q2 2026, increasing by 10,483 vehicles, or 19.9%, from the previous quarter. This represented the highest quarterly growth rate since Q1 2024, indicating sustained momentum in EV uptake despite growth occurring from a significantly larger fleet base.
- While licensing data does not directly capture purchase motivations, fuel price-related uncertainty may have contributed to increased EVs market activity during the quarter. Given the lag between vehicle purchase and licensing, the stronger growth recorded in Q2 may continue to be reflected in Q3 2026.



EV Uptake across metropolitan and regional WA

- Growth was also evident across regional WA, with several regions recording stronger percentage growth than the Perth metropolitan area. While the Perth metropolitan area remains the dominant EV market, the South West, Peel, Wheatbelt, Great Southern, Mid West and Goldfields-Esperance regions each recorded quarterly growth above 20%.
- Within the Perth metropolitan area, EV licence growth was particularly strong in the north-eastern and eastern growth corridors. Postcodes 6069, covering Aveley, Belhus, Brigadoon, Ellenbrook, The Vines and Upper Swan, and 6055 covering Brabham, Bushmead, Caversham, Dayton, Guildford, Hazelmere, Henley Brook, South Guildford and West Swan, recorded the highest percentage growth among major metropolitan EV markets in Q2 2026, at 25.5% and 26.4% respectively.



Figure 1a: Graph - Cumulative electric vehicle data December 2021 to June 2026

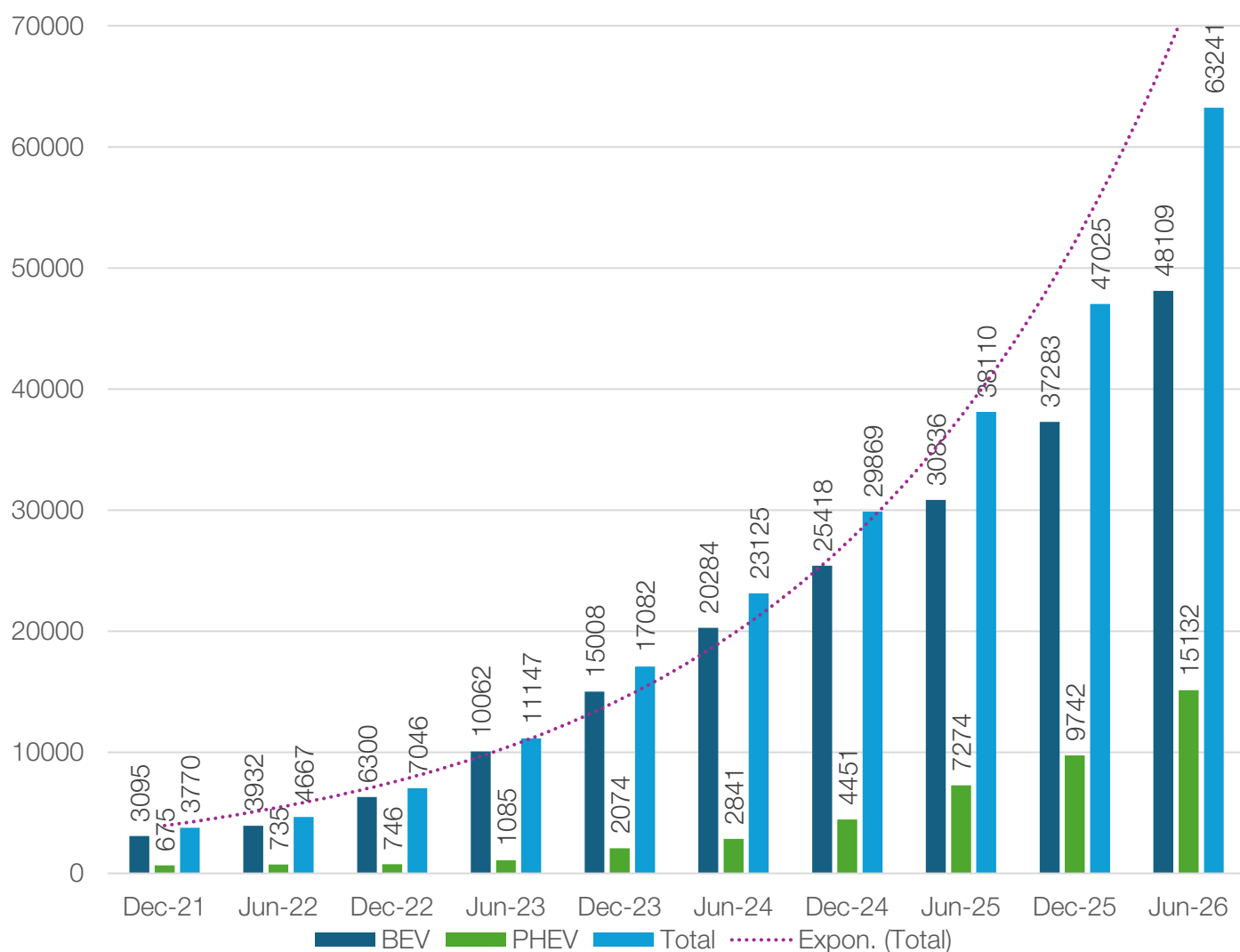


Figure 1b: Table - Cumulative electric vehicle data December 2021 to June 2026
