



Showing ID to ask for a driver's licence

When you ask for a driver's licence, learner's permit or photo card, you must show who you are. You must show some different cards and papers.

You must show five cards or papers. They must be originals, not copies. There are two ways you can put the documents together:

You can show:

- 1 document from category A and B,
- 2 documents from category C and;
- 1 document from category D

OR

You can show:

- 1 document from category A,
- 2 documents from category C and;
- 2 documents from category D.

Category A

- Birth certificate.

Category B

- WA photo card.
- A form where your parents say who you are, called 'parental identification and statutory declaration'.

Category C

- Bank statement less than 6 months old.
- Medicare card.
- Healthcare card.
- Centrelink card or Centerlink statement.
- Proof of age card.

Category D

- A letter from a school principal, showing your address. The letter must be less than one year old. The school must be a school that the government knows.
- A letter from your work, showing your address. The letter must be less than 6 months old.
- Lease paper for the place where you live now (called a residential tenancy agreement).
- Letter from Driving Access and Equity Program organisations showing residential address.

Sometimes, a paper from Category C shows your address where you live now. You can use it for Category D. If you want to ask about other papers you can use, talk to a worker at the Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure office. Or look at www.transport.wa.gov.au/licensing on the internet.
