

The Fremantle Container Rail Subsidy

HOW THE SUBSIDY IS PAID

RAIL CUSTOMER

Receives \$50 subsidy for each eligible container

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RAIL OPERATOR

Invoices DoT for subsidy provided to rail customers

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT

Reviews and pays the Rail Operator's invoices

Eligible containers are:

- Full containers transported by rail between North Quay Rail Terminal (NQRT), and either Forrestfield Intermodal Terminal or Kwinana Intermodal Terminal.
- Containers that are filled with hay and received by rail at NQRT for international export.

Ineligible containers are:

- Interstate or Kalgoorlie-based full containers transported by rail.
- Empty containers transported by rail.

The Rail Operator:

- Passes the subsidy directly and in full to rail customers.
- Only receives the subsidy payment in retrospect.



HOW THE SUBSIDY IS GOVERNED

Funding:

The State
 Government
 allocates funding
 to the
 Department of
 Transport
 through the

State Budget

The Department of Transport monitors:

- Key Performance Indicator (KPI) (the percentage of containers on rail)
- Budget v Actual Expenditure

... and assesses data consistency on a quarterly basis

Auditing processes:

- An external auditor annually examines the Rail Operator and Department of Transport processes
- The Office of the Auditor General annually audits KPI compliance
