Expression of Interest Form

The Western Australian Bicycle Network (WABN) grants program is an initiative of the Western Australian State Government, administered by the Department of Transport (DoT).

Grant funding is available to local governments in Western Australia, up to 50 per cent of the total project cost, for the planning and implementation of bicycle network infrastructure in accordance with State Government priorities set out in the <u>WABN Plan</u>.

Projects are encouraged to be spread over two financial years to facilitate high quality planning and design. To enable project staging, funding may be applied for in both the 2020–21 and 2021–22 financial years.

Important

This form is for application to the Expression of Interest (EOI) stage only. All applicants will be notified of the status of their EOI application in August 2019 and shortlisted projects will then be invited to apply to the Full Proposal round. Local governments can submit multiple EOIs however please note that a maximum of three applications per LGA will be invited to the full application stage.

Before you begin, download a copy of the WABN Grants Application Guidelines and Program Timeline documents which provide essential information on the program and on how to complete this application form.

Applicants are strongly encouraged to contact DoT to discuss their project prior to submission.

Submitting applications

Electronic submissions (not scanned) are required and are submitted to the Cycling Team via the 'submit form' button at the end of this document. The form must be completed with the required digital signature, not an inserted or scanned signature. Click the signature box and follow the prompts to insert/create a digital signature.

The deadline for EOI applications to the 2020–21 /2021–22 grant round is 25 July 2019.
