APPROVAL UNDER REGULATION 289(1)(a)(ii) TO DISPLAY YELLOW FLASHING WARNING LIGHTS ON VEHICLES SPRAYING PESTICIDES

Pursuant to Regulation 289(1)(a)(ii) of the *Road Traffic Code 2000*, I Christopher Davers, Assistant Director, Strategy and Policy, Department of Transport, pursuant to a delegation from the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Transport, dated 16 September 2015, hereby approve vehicles, hereafter named 'approved vehicles', used for verge or park pesticide spraying operations, in accordance with the requirements of the *Health (Pesticides) Regulations 2011*, to use yellow flashing warning lights at all times while the verge or park spraying operation is in progress, subject to the following conditions:

CONDITIONS

1. Any approved vehicle using yellow flashing warning lights under the provisions of this approval must comply with the applicable requirements of the *Health (Pesticides) Regulations 2011*, in particular Regulation 88 of those Regulations.
2. Approved vehicles must only use yellow flashing warning lights and no other colours of flashing warning lights.
3. The yellow flashing warning lights must be removed or covered when an approved vehicle is not being operated in accordance with the conditions of this approval.

NOTE

1. This approval provides an exemption from the offence contained in Regulation 193 of the *Road Traffic Code 2000* prohibiting the use of flashing warning lights. It does not permit non-compliance with any other provisions of the *Road Traffic Code 2000* and does not give the driver or any passenger of any approved vehicle priority in traffic over other road users.
