Green Head Maritime Facility

Green Head is a small coastal town situated 288 kilometres north of Perth, in the Shire of Coorow. The town has a population of 256 people, with rock lobster and fishing with a rapidly growing tourism market.

The many bays, islands and reefs along the coastline have many great spots for swimming, snorkelling, diving and fishing. There is also a local sea lion breeding colony. Popular water sports include surfing and wind surfing.

The facility comprises a service jetty and boat ramps operated by the Shire of Coorow.

Boating facility fees

Boating facilities

Service jetty

Jetty	One 'L' shaped jetty consisting of steel tubular piles, with timber half caps, stringers and deck.
Dimensions	Head: 20m x 20m Approach neck length: 90m
Services	Water, single and three phase power, lighting.

Boat ramp

A recreational dual lane concrete boat ramp, with a catwalk, was completed in 2000. There is also another single lane boat ramp with car parking facilities situated at South Bay Green Head. Both ramps are owned and operated by the Shire of Coorow.

Note: Boat users unfamiliar with local conditions should contact the local Volunteer Sea Search and Rescue Group before any boating trip

Other facilities and services

Public toilets

There are public toilets and an outdoor cold water shower available near the jetty and boat ramp. There is also a larger facility with cold water indoor showers located about 500 metres south of the jetty at Dynamite Bay.

Public car park

There is a sealed car park located near the jetty abutment.

Marine rescue

All marine rescue groups monitor radio listening watches on marine radio 27.88 MHz and VHF Channel 16. Most groups also monitor other frequencies such as 27.90 MHz, 27.91 MHz and VHF channels 72 and 73, as well as their own channels.

Don't hesitate to call any marine rescue group on your marine radio.

Remember to log on before heading out and log off when you return with your local marine rescue group, for full radio procedure refer to Boat rules at a glance.
