permitted on the waters of Wellington Dam. All other motorised vessels including personal watercraft (PWC) also known as jet Only vessels fitted with a motor equal to or less than 6Hp are skis, are prohibited.

When navigating, skippers should be aware that trees and tree stumps may be present and take extra care when navigating close to shore and during times of low water levels.

A speed limit of 8 knots exists within 50 metres of any shoreline. **Closed waters all vessels**

Closed waters motorised vessels

Motorised vessels must not operate within 100 metres of the shore at Potters Gorge.
