Western Australian electric vehicle licensing data

March 2025 Quarter



This publication provides statistics on the number of electric vehicles (EVs) licensed in Western Australia (WA) by the Department of Transport (DoT) and denotes trends in the uptake of EVs.

Key insights

March 2025 quarter Western Australian electric vehicle trends



EVs accounted for an increasing proportion of newly licensed vehicles

- The number of licensed EVs in WA grew by 12.77 per cent in Q1 2025, a slower growth rate compared to the 13.83 per cent increase in Q4 2024.
- Overall light vehicle licensing slowed from 47,390 in Q4 2024 to 40,019 this quarter, while EVs accounted for a higher percentage of newly licensed vehicles, rising from 7.58 per cent to 9.52 per cent.
- More EVs are licensed for personal use than for business use, with 27,118 licensed for personal use (80.61 per cent) compared to 6,524 licensed for business use (19.39 per cent).
- As of 31 March 2025, there was a total of 2,134,738 licensed light vehicles in the state, of which 33,639 were licensed light EVs.
- WA's \$3,500 Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) Rebate Scheme was still in place during the March quarter with the scheme expiring 10 May 2025¹.



New PHEVs licensed in Q1 2025 surged beyond previous trends prior to FBT changes

- PHEVs grew by 22.57 per cent in Q4 2024, and by 36.43 per cent in Q1 2025, significantly exceeding previous growth trends.
- The rise in PHEV licensing precedes a policy change effective 1 April 2025, when PHEVs will no longer qualify for the electric car exemption under fringe benefits tax (FBT) law².



EV adoption growing across regional areas

- The Perth metropolitan area holds 90.41 per cent of WA's licensed EVs (30,413), however EV adoption is starting to spread beyond the urban core, with regional areas showing notable growth from a smaller base.
- EV licensing quarter-on-quarter growth rates in the regions exceeded that of the Perth metropolitan area with 12.50 per cent for Perth, compared with 15.26 per cent for the South West, 13.77 per cent for Peel and 17.06 per cent for the Wheatbelt.
- The Pilbara experienced the highest EV licensing increase of 38.78 per cent in Q1 2025 to a total of 136 vehicles, noting the relatively small base of 98 licenced vehicles recorded in the previous quarter.






Figure 1b: Table - Cumulative electric vehicle data December 2021-March 2025
