The Department of Transport and Major Infrastructure (DTMI) has managed Two Rocks Marina since 2014 and tens of millions of dollars have been invested to improve the facility in consultation with users and the local community.

Unless special permission is obtained from Two Rock Marina management the following is prohibited:

- exceeding the 5 knot speed limit within the harbour limits;
- swimming or diving within the harbour and harbour entrance;
- windsurfers, hard surfboards, personal water craft (PWC) freestyling, towing skiers or other buoyant equipment;
- cleaning fish and dumping offal or rubbish into the harbour;
- placing fishing nets, pots, lines or floats within the harbour or entrance channel;
- anchoring a vessel anywhere within the harbour or entrance channel unless broken down or in distress;
- use of the service wharf (except for penholders for the purpose of loading/ unloading passengers and cargo). Two Rocks Service Wharf is not public - it is used by commercial fleet to load and unload rock lobster; and
- refuelling except at designated fuelling jetty on service wharf.
